


Mapping Your Home

Collection Connection

This drawing comes from JANM's Yamashita family collection. During World War II, Gihachi Yamashita was separated from the rest of his family and imprisoned in various detention centers. His wife, Tsugio and daughters, Lillian, and Angela were sent to a temporary detention center in Santa Anita, CA before being sent to a concentration camp in Rohwer, AK.

Lillian was around 14 years old when she sent her father this detailed drawing of the family's barracks in Rohwer. She

drew the exterior as well as a floorplan of the interior. At the time, Gihachi was living in Camp Livingston, LA. He displayed the drawing in the mess hall so others could see what a barrack and room looked like.


Now it's your turn!
