- Entrance times are on the hour, every hour, starting at 11 a.m. until 4 p.m.
- Admission is accepted up to 30 minutes after your ticket time.
- JANM Members, please show your current membership card for admission.
- For all free or discount programs and passes, please show proof of eligibility upon entry.
- Thursdays are **FREE** admission from 5 p.m. to 8 p.m.; last entry 7 p.m.
- Every third Thursday of the month is **FREE** admission all day; last entry 7 p.m.

Visitor Policies

- Masks are strongly recommended for all visitors during your visit, except for children age two and younger.
- No food or drinks permitted in the museum. No flash photography.
- A limited number of self-serve storage lockers (9"W x 22"H x 16"D) are available on a first-come basis. Valid ID required to use lockers. Large bags are not permitted. JANM cannot hold any jackets, clothing, or bags outside of lockers.
- Only trained service animals are allowed.


